### Judowibowo "Bowo" Poerwowidagdo, American Field Service Foreign Exchange Student

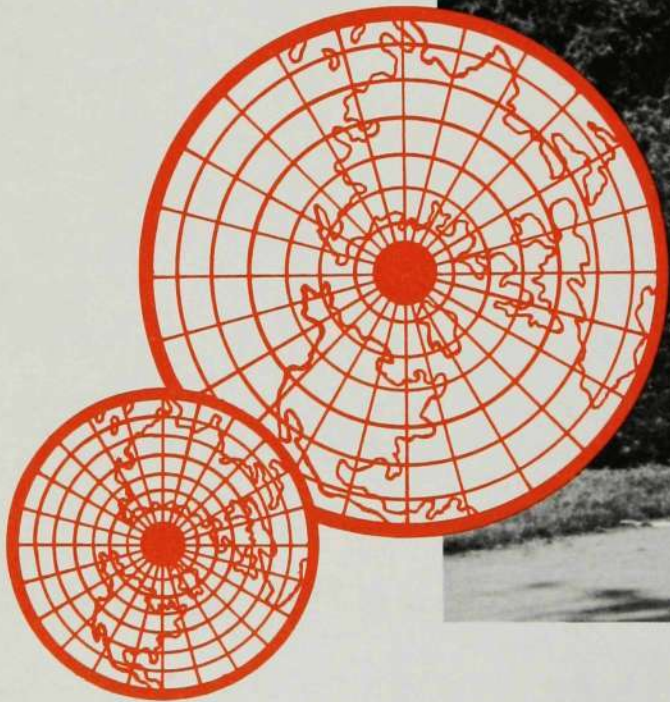
"Walk together, talk together, o ye people of the earth, then and then only, we shall have peace." A.F.S. motto.

Mr. O'Neill started his career after graduating from Central Missouri Institute with a mathematics major. In 1932 he started working in Oakland at Bret Harte where he remained for 12 years before moving to San Leandro High School for eight years, Fremont for one, Frick for one, and Tech for seven years. At Tech he was varsity football coach for two years, junior varsity football coach for five years, and varsity tennis and golf coach for six years.

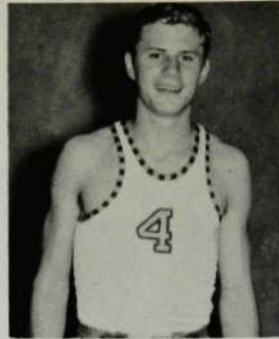




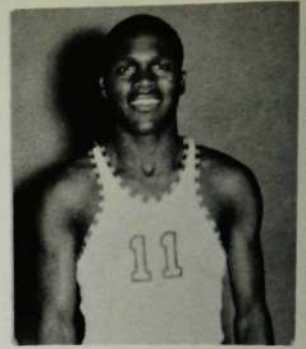
